ORDINANCE NO 2012-0-538

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING "OFFENSES INVOLVING DRUGS"

WHEREAS, the Village of Oblong Police Department and the Village Attorney have reviewed the various ordinances of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, involving the use and sale of drugs and drug paraphernalia; and

WHEREAS, the Police Chief of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, has recommended to the Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Illinois to adopt this ordinance to deal with offenses involving drugs within the Village of Oblong, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, believes it to be in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, to adopt this ordinance entitled "Offenses Involving Drugs."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, CRAWFORD COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: The Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, hereby adopts "Offenses Involving Drugs" as more fully set forth below:

DEFINITIONS:

The following terms shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates that a different meaning is intended:

CANNABIS: Includes marijuana, hashish or other substances which are identified as including any parts of the plant Cannabis sativa, whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of such plant; and any compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of such plant, its seeds, or resin, including tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) and all other synthetically produced ingredients, whether produced directly or indirectly by extraction, or independently by means of chemical synthesis or by a combination of extraction and chemical synthesis; but shall not include the mature stalks of such plant, fiber produced from such stalks, oil or cake made from the seeds of such plant, any other compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of such mature stalks (except the resin extracted therefrom), fiber, oil or cake, or the sterilized seeds of such plant. Cannabis shall also include any substance defined as cannabis in Section 3 of

the Illinois Cannabis Control Act 720 Illinois Compiled Statutes 550/3 et seq., and hereafter amended.

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE: Any substance as defined in Article II of the Illinois Controlled Substances Act 720 Illinois Compiled Statutes 570/201 et seq.

DELIVER OR DELIVERY: Actual, constructive or attempted transfer of possession of cannabis, with or without consideration, whether or not there is an agency relationship.

DRUG PARAPHERNALIA: All equipment, products, and material of any kind which are intended to be used unlawfully in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, harvesting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, containing, concealing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing into the human body cannabis or a controlled substance in violation of this title, the Cannabis Control Act, 720 Illinois Compiled Statutes 500/et seq., or the Illinois Controlled Substances Act, 720 Illinois Compiled Statutes 570/et seq. It includes, but is not limited to:

- A. Its intended to be used unlawfully in manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing, or preparing cannabis or a controlled substance;
- **B.** Isomerization devices intended to be used unlawfully in increasing the potency of any species of plant which is cannabis or a controlled substance;
- **C.** Testing equipment intended to be used unlawfully in a private home for identifying or in analyzing the strength, effectiveness, or purity of cannabis or controlled substances;
- **D.** Diluents and adulterants intended to be used unlawfully for cutting cannabis or a controlled substance by private persons;
- **E.** Objects intended to be used unlawfully in ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing cannabis, cocaine, hashish oil into the human body including, where applicable, the following items:
 - 1. Water pipes;
 - 2. Carburetion tubes and devises;
 - 3. Smoking and carburetion masks;
 - 4. Miniature cocaine spoons and cocaine vials;
 - 5. Carburetor pipes;
 - 6. Electric pipes;
 - 7. Air driven pipes;
 - 8. Chillums;
 - 9. Bongs;
 - 10. Ice pipes or chillers;
- **F.** Any item whose purpose, as announced or described by the seller, is for use in violation of this act.

KNOWLEDGE: Knows, acts knowingly or with knowledge:

A. The nature or attendant circumstances of his/her conduct, described by the section defining the offense, when he/she is consciously aware that his/her conduct is of

- such nature or that such circumstances exist. Knowledge of a material fact includes awareness of the substantial probability that such facts exists.
- B. The result of his/her conduct, described by the section defining the offense, when he/she is consciously aware that such result is likely to be caused by his/her conduct.
- C. Knowledge may be inferred from the surrounding circumstances.

MANUFACTURE: The production, preparation, propagation, compounding, conversion or processing of cannabis, either directly or indirectly, by extraction from substances of natural origin, or independently by means of chemical synthesis, and includes any packaging or repackaging of cannabis or labeling of its container, except that this term does not include the preparation, compounding, packaging or labeling of cannabis as an incident to lawful research, teaching or chemical analysis and not for sale.

NITROUS OXIDE (N20): A colorless flammable gas used as an anesthetic and in aerosols.

NITROUS OXIDE CARTRIDGE: Any cartridge containing less than twenty (20) ounces of compressed nitrous oxide (N20).

PERSON: Any individual, corporation, business trust, estate, trust, partnership or association, or any other entity.

POSSESSION: Possession may be either actual or constructive.

- A. Actual possession means exercising physical dominion.
- B. Constructive possession may be inferred if the defendant has intent and capacity to maintain control and dominion over the cannabis or drug paraphernalia.

PRODUCE OR PRODUCTION: Planting, cultivating, tending or harvesting.

POSSESSION OF CANNABIS PROHIBITED:

- A. <u>Violation</u>: No person shall possess any amount of cannabis or any substance containing cannabis.
- B. <u>Penalty</u>: Any person who pleads guilty or is found guilty by a court of the Village of Oblong or State of Illinois shall be punished by a minimum fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) and no more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00).
- C. <u>Administrative Fee</u>: In addition, any person who violates any provision of this section and is convicted, pleads guilty, receives court supervision or probation by a court of law shall be ordered to pay an administrative fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to be paid to the law enforcement agency for testing of the substance(s) collected.

- D. <u>Forfeiture</u>: Any items which may be seized or forfeited pursuant to Section 720 Illinois Compiled Statutes 550/12, may be forfeited in the same manner as described therein for a violation of this section.
- E. <u>Exception</u>: Any person, who manufactures, distributes, dispenses, or is in possession of any controlled substance for research purposes pursuant to 720 Illinois Compiled Statutes550/11, as hereafter amended, shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.

POSSESSION OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA PROHIBITED:

- A. <u>Violation</u>: No person shall knowingly possess any item of drug paraphernalia with the intent to use it for the purpose of unlawfully ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing cannabis or a controlled substance into the human body, or in preparing cannabis or a controlled substance for that use within the corporate limits of the Village of Oblong. In determining intent for purposes of this section, the tier of fact may take into consideration the proximity of the cannabis or controlled substances to drug paraphernalia or the presence of cannabis or a controlled substance on the drug paraphernalia.
- B. <u>Penalty</u>: Any person who pleads guilty or is found guilty by a court of the Village of Oblong or State of Illinois shall be punished by a minimum fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) and no more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00).
- C. <u>Forfeiture</u>: "Drug paraphernalia" as defined herein, seized by police officers pursuant to an arrest or issuance of a notice to appear for a violation of this section, shall be forfeited to the Village upon a plea of guilty, a finding of guilt and/or a disposition of court supervision or probation by a court of law or upon the individual utilizing any administrative remedy allowed by the Village without further order of the court. Any other items which may be seized or forfeited pursuant to Section 720 Illinois Compiled Statues 600/5, may be forfeited in the same manner as described therein for a violation of this section.
- D. <u>Exemptions</u>: This section does not apply to:
 - Items used in the preparation, compounding, packaging, labeling, or use of cannabis
 or a controlled substance as an incident to lawful research, teaching or chemical
 analysis and not for sale.
 - 2. Items historically and customarily used in connection with the planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, harvesting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, containing, concealing, injecting, ingesting, or inhaling of tobacco or any other lawful substance unless such item has the presence of cannabis or a controlled substance. Items exempt under this subsection include, but are not limited to, garden hoses, rakes, sickles, baggies, tobacco pipes, and cigarette rolling papers.
 - 3. Items listed in the definition of "drug paraphernalia" in the definitions section of this ordinance if said items are used solely for decorative purposes, when such items

- have been rendered completely inoperable or incapable of being used for any illicit purposes prohibited by this ordinance.
- 4. A person who is legally authorized to possess hypodermic syringes or needles under the Hypodermic Syringes and Needles Act, 720 Illinois Compiled Statutes 635/0.01 et seq.

SALE OR DELIVERY OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA PROHIBITED:

- A. <u>Violation</u>: It shall be unlawful for any person to keep for sale, offer for sale, or deliver any commercial consideration any item of drug paraphernalia within the corporate limits of the Village of Oblong, Illinois.
- B. Penalty: Any person who pleads guilty or is found guilty by a court of the Village of Oblong or State of Illinois shall be punished by a minimum fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) and no more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for each item of drug paraphernalia. In addition thereto, any individual or entity while who is found guilty of the sales or delivery of drug paraphernalia and the same occurred at a business establishment owned by said individual or entity while employed there, said business establishment is subject to loss of any operating license as issued by the Village of Oblong or State of Illinois in addition to the fines described hereinabove.
- C. <u>Forfeiture</u>: "Drug paraphernalia" as defined herein, seized by police officers pursuant to an arrest or issuance of a notice to appear for a violation of this section, shall be forfeited to the Village upon a plea of guilty, a finding of guilt and/or a disposition of court supervision or probation by a court of law or upon the individual utilizing any administrative remedy allowed by the Village without further order of the court. Any other items which may be seized or forfeited pursuant to Section 720 Illinois Compiled Statutes 600/5, may be forfeited in the same manner as described therein for a violation of this section.

NITROUS OXIDE:

- A. <u>Unlawful Safe or Distribution Prohibited</u>: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation, co-partnership or association to possess any container or cartridge which contains nitrous oxide (N2O) for the purpose of selling, offering for sale, distributing or giving away N2O; except that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to wholesalers, jobbers, and manufacturers who use N2O in the normal course of their business to manufacture other lawful items.
- B. <u>Unlawful Use</u>: It shall be unlawful for any person to inhale, or otherwise introduce into his respiratory system, N2O except under the direct care and supervision of a licensed physician or dentist.
- C. <u>Penalty</u>: Any person who pleads guilty or is found guilty by a court of the Village of Oblong or the State of Illinois shall be punished by a minimum fine of not less than \$250.00 and no more than \$750.00 for each offense.

<u>Section 2</u>: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in pamphlet form.

<u>Section 3</u>: This ordinance is made pursuant to the Village of Oblong, Illinois and any and all publication periods, except as otherwise set forth hereinabove are hereby waived.

ORDINANCE NO 2012-0-539

AN ORDINANCE AMEMDING CHAPTER 27 OF THE VILLAGE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, ILLINOIS TO INCLUDE THE PROHIBITION OF SALE, POSSESSION OR DELIVERY OF SYNTHETIC CANNABIS

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2012-O-538, provides for the offenses of involving drugs and the prohibition thereof; and

WHEREAS, the sale, production, and possession of Synthetic Cannabis has become a significant problem within the Village of Oblong, Illinois in regards to the effect it has upon the health of individuals as well as the safety and welfare of other individuals within the Village of Oblong; and

WHEREAS, the Village Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, believes it to be in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, to ban the sale, possession, delivery or production of Synthetic Cannabis within the Village of Oblong, Illinois.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDIANED BY THE VILLAGE TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, CRAWFORD COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: That Chapter 27 is hereby amended to include the following entitled "Prohibition of Sale, Possession, Delivery or Production of Synthetic Cannabis" which shall read as follows:

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PROHIBITION OF SALE, POSSESSION, DELIVERY OR PRODUCTION OF SYNTHETIC CANNABIS:

DEFINITIONS:

The following terms shall have the following meanings unless the context indicates otherwise that a different meaning is intended:

SYNTHETIC CANNABIS: Includes but not limited to the brand names K2 and Spice. It is an herbal and chemical product which mimics the effects of Cannabis including but not limited to Synthetic Cannabinoids, Cannabicyclohyexanol, JWH-018 and HU-210.

DELIVER OR DELIVERY: Actual, constructive or attempted transfer of possession of Synthetic Cannabis, with or without consideration, whether or not there is an agency relationship.

KNOWLEDGE: Knows, acts knowingly or with knowledge.

A. The nature or attendant circumstances of his/her conduct, described by the section defining the offense, when he/she is consciously aware that his/her conduct is of such nature or that such circumstances exist. Knowledge of a material fact includes awareness of the substantial probability that such fact exists.

- B. The result of his/her conduct, described by the section defining the offense, when he/she is consciously aware that such result is likely to be caused by his/her conduct.
- C. Knowledge may be inferred from the surrounding circumstances.

MANUFACTURE: The production, preparation, propagation, compounding, conversion or processing of Synthetic Cannabis, either directly or indirectly, by extraction from substances of natural origin, or independently by means of chemical synthesis, and includes any packaging or repackaging of Synthetic Cannabis or labeling of its container, except that this term does not include the preparation, compounding, packaging or labeling of Synthetic Cannabis as an incident to lawful research, teaching or chemical analysis and not for sale.

PERSON: Any individual, corporation business trust, estate, trust, partnership or association, or any other entity.

POSSESSION: Possession may be either actual or constructive.

- A. Actual possession means exercising physical dominion.
- B. Constructive possession may be inferred if the defendant has intent and capacity to maintain control and dominion over the Cannabis or drug paraphernalia.

PRODUCE OR PRODUCTION: Planting, cultivating, tending or harvesting.

POSSESSION OF SYNTHETIC CANNABIS PROHIBITED: No person shall possess any substance containing Synthetic Cannabis nor shall any person produce or deliver any substance containing Synthetic Cannabis.

PENALTIES: Any person who pleads guilty or is found guilty by the Court of the Village of Oblong, Illinois or other Court shall be punished by a minimum fine of not less than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) and no more than Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) for each offense.

Any items which may be seized or forfeited pursuant to this section or Section 720 Illinois Compiled Statutes 550/12 may be forfeited in the same manner described therein for violation of this ordinance.

In addition thereto, any individual possessing, selling, delivering or manufacturing Synthetic Cannabis or any of the other forms thereof as set forth in this ordinance and said individual is an owner, manager, employee or agent of any business either by a licensee, agent or employee thereof, said business shall be subject to further fines, suspensions or revocation of any Village license required to operate said business.

EXCEPTION: Any person, who manufactures, distributes, dispenses, or is in possession of any controlled substance or Synthetic Cannabis for research purposes pursuant to 720 Illinois Compiled Statutes 550/11, as hereafter amended, shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.

Section 2: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on the 4^{th} day of January, 2012, and publication in pamphlet form.

Section 3: If any part of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining provisions of this ordinance, or any part thereof and said ordinance shall be read as if said invalid provision was struck therefrom and the context thereof changed accordingly with the remainder of the ordinance shall be in full force and effect.

<u>Section 4</u>: This ordinance is made pursuant to the authority of the Village of Oblong, Illinois.

ORDINANCE NO. 2012-0-540

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 27 OF THE VILLAGE CODES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, ILLINOIS TO INCLUDE PROHIBITING THE SALE AND POSSESSION OF MEPHEDRONE AND METHYLENEDIOXYPROVALERONE (MDPV)

WHEREAS, Chapter 27 if the Village Codes of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, sets forth various offenses involving drugs; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, to control and minimize the use of Synthetic Cocaine and substances that contain Cocaine or mimic Cocaine; and

WHEREAS, the legislature of the State of Illinois has not yet acted upon said drugs to ban the possession or sale of the Synthetic Cocaine also known as "Bath Salts"; and

WHEREAS, 3.4 Methylenedioxyprovalerone (MDPV), Methylone, Mephedrone, 4-Methoxymethcathinoe, 4-Fluoromethcathinine, and 3-Fluoromethcathinone are psychoactive drugs with stimulant properties which act as norepinephrine-dopamine reuptake inhibitors which have no Food and Drug Administration approved medical use and which produce physiological and psychological effects similar to cocaine and amphetamines; and

WHEREAS, these chemicals are reported to cause dangerous physiological effects and MDPV is presently listed as a controlled substance in the United Kingdom, Finland, Denmark and Sweden but is not listed as a scheduled drug (controlled substance) in the United States, except for Louisiana, Kentucky, and Florida; and

WHEREAS, this chemical is marketed to the public as "bath salt" under various street names such as "Cloud 9", "Ivory Wave", "Ocean", "Charge Plus", "White Lightning", "White Girl", "Scarface", "Hurricane Charlie", "Vanilla Sky", "Bonzia Grow", "Blue Silk", "Blue Magic", "Serenity Now", "Lovey Dovey", "Euphoria", "Aura", "Red Dove", and "White Dove"; and

WHEREAS, said Synthetic Cocaine—Bath Salts are available to sale to minors and used by individuals with consequences including death to either themselves or others; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, believes it to be in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, to amend Chapter 27 to include prohibition of possession and sale of said Synthetic Cocaine—Bath Salts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, CRAWFORD COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1: That Chapter 27 is hereby amended to read as follows:

MPDV PROHIBITED

(A) PURPOSES: This section of the Village Codes of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, is enacted to protect, preserve and promote the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, by prohibiting the possession, distribution or delivery of any substance containing MDPV as hereinafter defined, it being the specific finding of the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, that such substances have a dangerous affect upon any one using said substances and have no medicinal or beneficial purpose.

(B) **DEFINITIONS**:

- (1) MEPHEDRONE: also known as the 4-Methylmethcathinone (4-MMC), or 4-Methylephedrone, is a synthetic stimulant and entactogen drug of the amphetamine and cathinone classes.
- (2) METHYLENEDIOXYPROVALERONE (MDPV): is a psychedelic psychoactive drug with stimulant properties which acts as a norepinephrine-dopamine reuptake inhibitor (NDRI). It is also sometimes known as MDPK, Magic, Super Coke and PV.
- (3) "Deliver", the actual, constructive, or attempted transfer from one person to another of MDPV, whether or not there is an agency relationship, and includes a sale;
- (4) "Distribute", to deliver other than by administering or dispensing MDPV;
- (5) "MDPV", includes any material, compound, mixture or preparation containing any quantity of the following substances having a stimulant effect on the central nervous system, including their salts, isomers and salts of isomers of 3.4 Methylenedioxyprovalerone. Methylone, Mephedrone, 4-Methoxymethcathinone, 4-Fluormetcathinine, and 3- Fluorometcathinine;
- (6) "Possess", means with the knowledge of the presence and nature of a substance, either actually or constructively in control of a substance. A person has actual possession if he has the substance on his person or within easy reach and convenient control. A person who although not in actual possession, has the power and intention at a given time to exercise dominion or control over the substance either directly or through another person or persons is in constructive possession of it.
- (C) MANUFACTURE: The production, preparation, propagation, compounding, conversion or processing of Synthetic Cocaine or a substance containing Cocaine, either directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of natural origin, or independently by means of chemical synthesis, and includes any packaging or repackaging of any Synthetic Cocaine or a substance containing Cocaine or labeling of its container, except that this term does not include the preparation, compounding, packaging or labeling of Synthetic Cocaine as

an incident to lawful research, teaching or chemical analysis and not for sale or delivery for the intended use.

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- (D) **POSSESSION PROHIBITED:** No person shall possess any substance containing Synthetic Cocaine or a substance containing Cocaine and Mephedrone and MDPV (Methylenedioxyprovalerone) are hereby declared and defined as a controlled substance as the term is used in this ordinance and possession, use or delivery of either, is hereby declared illegal and a violation of Village Ordinance. Furthermore, no individual or entity shall sell, give, deliver or provide to any other individual said substances.
- (E) **PENALTIES:** Any person who pleads guilty or is found guilty by the Court of the Village of Oblong, State of Illinois, or other Court shall be punished by a minimum fine of not less than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) and no more than Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) for each offense.

In addition thereto, any individual possessing, selling, delivering or manufacturing MDPV or any of the other forms thereof as set forth in this ordinance and said individual is an owner, manager, employee or agent of any business entity in the Village of Oblong, Illinois, which requires a business license and said sale, possession, delivery or manufacture occurs upon, in or through said business either by a licensee, agent or employee thereof, said business shall be subject to further fines, suspensions or revocation of any Village license required to operate said business.

Section 2: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on the 4^{th} day of January, 2012, and publication in pamphlet form.

<u>Section 3</u>: If any part of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining provisions of this ordinance, or any part thereof and said ordinance shall be read as if said invalid provision was struck therefrom and the context thereof changed accordingly with the remainder of the ordinance shall be in full force and effect.

<u>Section 4</u>: This ordinance is made pursuant to the authority of the Village of Oblong, Illinois.

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE

SECTION 2: That the appropriation herein made for any purpose shall be regarded as the maximum amounts to be expended under the respective appropriation accounts and shall not be construed as a commitment, agreement, obligation or liability of the Village of Oblong, and such appropriation being subject to further approval as to expenditure thereof by the Village Board.

SECTION 3: That the amount appropriated for each object and purpose shall be as follows:

SECTION 4: That if any section, subdivision, or sentence of this ordinance shall for any reason be held invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this ordinance.

SECTION 5: That a Certified Copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the Crawford County Clerk within 30 days after adoption.

SECTION 6: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval, and publication, as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2012-0-542

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 30: PUBLIC SAFETY, ARTICLE II: POLICE DEPARTMENT, SECTION 30-2-20: PART-TIME OFFICERS OF THE VILLAGE CODES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, CRAWFORD COUNTY, ILLINOIS

The Corporate Authorities of the Village of Oblong, Crawford County, Illinois, hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. PART-TIME POLICE.

- A. <u>Employment</u>. The Village of Oblong may employ part-time police officers from time to time as they deem necessary.
- B. <u>Duties</u>. A part-time police officer shall have all the responsibilities of a full-time police officer and such specific duties as delineated in the General Orders of the Oblong Police Department, but the number of hours a part-time officer may work within a calendar year is restricted. Part-time police officers shall not be assigned to supervise or direct full-time police officers. Part-time police officers shall be trained in accordance with the Illinois Police Training Act (50 ILCS 705/1 et. Seq.) and the rules and requirements of the ILETSB.
- C. <u>Hiring Standards</u>. Any person employed as a part-time police officer must meet the following standards.
 - Be of good moral character, of temperate habits, of sound health, and physically and mentally able to perform assigned duties.
 - 2. Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age.
 - 3. Possess a high school diploma or GED certificate.
 - 4. Possess a valid State of Illinois driver's license.
 - 5. Possess no prior felony convictions.
 - 6. Any individual who has served in the U.S. military must have been honorably discharged.
- D. <u>Discipline</u>. Part-time officers shall be under the disciplinary jurisdiction of the chief of police. Part-time police officers serve at the discretion of the Village authorities, shall not have any property rights in said employment, and may be removed by the Village authorities at any time. Part-time police officers shall comply with all applicable rules and General Orders issued by the Police Department.

SECTION 2. That if any section, paragraph, clause, phrase or part of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance, and the application of these provisions to any person or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are herby repealed insofar as they conflict herewith.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage as provided by law.

ORDINANCE No. 2012-0-543

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An ACT regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Chapter 820 ILCS 130/1-12, Illinois Compiled Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Crawford County, investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village of Oblong, Crawford County, employed in performing construction of public works, for said Village of Oblong; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, CRAWFORD COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1

To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works" approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Oblong is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Crawford County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, 2012, a copy of that determination being attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which area also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2

Nothing herein shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works of this Village of Oblong, to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this Village of Oblong this

determination of such prevailing rate wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

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SECTION 4

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State Index Division and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall cause a notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area that the determination of prevailing wages has been made. Said notice shall conform substantially to the notice attached hereto. Such publication shall constitute notice that this is the determination of Village of Oblong and is effective.

Explanations

CRAWFORD COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

Oil and chip resealing (O&C) means the application of road oils and liquid asphalt to coat an existing road surface, followed by application of aggregate chips or gravel to coated surface, and subsequent rolling of material to seal the surface.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER, MARBLE FINISHER, TERRAZZO FINISHER

Assisting, helping or supporting the tile, marble and terrazzo mechanic by performing their historic and traditional work assignments required to complete the proper installation of the work covered by said crafts. The term "Ceramic" is used for naming the classification only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. Ceramic takes into consideration most hard tiles.

COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair, and service

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of radio, television, recording, voice sound and vision production and reproduction apparatus, equipment and appliances used for domestic, commercial, education, entertainment and private telephone systems.

ELECTRIC POWER LINEMAN

Construction, maintenance and dismantling of overhead and underground electric power lines, including high voltage pipe type cable work, and associated structures and equipment.

ELECTRIC POWER EQUIPMENT OPERATOR - CLASS 1

Operation of all crawler type equipment D-4 and larger from the ground to assist the Electric Power Linemen in performing their duties.

ELECTRIC POWER EQUIPMENT OPERATORS - CLASS 2

Operation of all other equipment from the ground to assist the Electric Power Linemen in performing their duties.

ELECTRIC POWER GROUNDMAN

Applies to workers who assist the Electric Power Lineman from the ground.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

- Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, vactor trucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination units, and ticket writers.
- Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics and working forepersons, and dispatchers. Five axle or more combination units.
- Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.
- Class 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing while employed on hazardous waste work.

TRUCK DRIVER - OIL AND CHIP RESEALING ONLY.

This shall encompass laborers, workers and mechanics who drive contractor or subcontractor owned, leased, or hired pickup, dump, service, or oil distributor trucks. The work includes transporting materials and equipment (including but not limited to, oils, aggregate supplies, parts, machinery and tools) to or from the job site; distributing oil or liquid asphalt and aggregate; stock piling material when in connection with the actual oil and chip contract. The Truck Driver (Oil & Chip Resealing) wage classification does not

include supplier delivered materials.

OPERATING ENGINEERS - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Power Cranes, Draglines, Derricks, Shovels, Gradalls, Mechanics, Tractor Highlift, Tournadozer, Concrete Mixers with Skip, Tournamixer, Two Drum Machine, One Drum Hoist with Tower or Boom, Cableways, Tower Machines, Motor Patrol, Boom Tractor, Boom or Winch Truck, Winch or Hydraulic Boom Truck, Truck Crane, Tournapull, Tractor Operating Scoops, Bulldozer, Push Tractor, Asphalt Planer, Finishing Machine on Asphalt, Large Rollers on Earth, Rollers on Asphalt Mix, Ross Carrier or similar Machine, Gravel Processing Machine, Asphalt Plant Engineer, Paver Operator, Dredging Equipment, or Dredge Engineer, or Dredge Operator, Central Mix Plant Engineer, CMT or similar type machine, Concrete Pump, Truck or Skid Mounted, Tower Crane, Engineer or Rock Crusher Plant, Concrete Plant Engineer, Ditching Machine with dual attachment, Tractor Mounted Loaders, Cherry Picker, Hydro Crane, Standard or Dinkey Locomotives, Scoopmobiles, Euclid Loader, Soil Cement Machine, Back Filler, Elevating Machine, Power Blade, Drilling Machine, including Well Testing, Caissons, Shaft or any similar type drilling machines, Motor Driven Paint Machine, Pipe Cleaning Machine, Pipe Wrapping Machine, Pipe Bending Machine, Apsco Paver, Boring Machine, (Head Equipment Greaser), Barber-Greene Loaders, Formless Paver, (Well Point System), Concrete Spreader, Hydra Ax, Span Saw, Marine Scoops, Brush Mulcher, Brush Burner, Mesh Placer, Tree Mover, Helicopter Crew (3), Filedriver-Skid or Crawler, Stump Remover, Root Rake, Tug Boat Operator, Refrigerating Machine, Freezing Operator, Chair Cart-Self-Propelled, Hydra Seeder, Straw Blower, Power Sub Grader, Bull Float, Finishing Machine, Self-Propelled Pavement Breaker, Lull (or similar type Machine), Two Air Compressors, Compressors hooked in Manifold, Overhead Crane, Chip Spreader, Mud Cat, Sull-Air, Fork Lifts (except when used for landscaping work), Soil Stabilizer (Seaman Tiller, Bo Mag, Rago Gator, and similar types of equipment), Tube Float, Spray Machine, Curing Machine, Concrete or Asphalt Milling Machine, Snooper Truck-Operator, Backhoe, Farm Tractors (with attachments), 4 Point Lift System (Power Lift or similar type), Skid-Steer (Bob Cat or similar type), Wrecking Shears, Water Blaster.

Class 2. Concrete Mixers without Skips, Rock Crusher, Ditching Machine under 6', Curbing Machine, One Drum Machines without Tower or Boom, Air Tugger, Self-Propelled Concrete Saw, Machine Mounted Post Hole Digger, two to four Generators, Water Pumps or Welding Machines, within 400 feet, Air Compressor 600 cu. ft. and under, Rollers on Aggregate and Seal Coat Surfaces, Fork Lift (when used for landscaping work), Concrete and Blacktop Curb Machine, One Water Pump, Oilers, Air Valves or Steam Valves, One Welding Machine, Truck Jack, Mud Jack, Gunnite Machine, House Elevators when used for hoisting material, Engine Tenders, Fireman, Wagon Drill, Flex Plane, Conveyor, Siphons and Pulsometer, Switchman, Fireman on Paint Pots, Fireman on Asphalt Plants, Distributor Operator on Trucks, Tampers, Self-Propelled Power Broom, Striping Machine (motor driven), Form Tamper, Bulk Cement Plant, Equipment Greaser, Deck Hands, Truck Crane Oiler-Driver, Cement Blimps, Form Grader, Temporary Heat, Throttle Valve, Super Sucker (and similar type of equipment).

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the

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Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

ORDINANCE NO. 544

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 21 OF THE <u>REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES</u> REGULATING THE USE OF GAMBLING DEVICES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, CRAWFORD COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, Section 21-3-16 of the Revised Code of Ordinances prohibits the keeping, placing, maintaining or operating of any gambling device or instrument in and upon premises used or occupied as a place where alcoholic liquor is sold or given away;

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the Illinois Gaming Board shall begin issuing licenses in the year 2012, under the Video Gaming Act (230 ILCS 40 et seq.) with respect to the manufacture, placing, operating and supplying parts for "video gaming terminals", as that term is defined in Section 5 of the Video Gaming Act (230 ILCS 40/5);

WHEREAS, in light of the legalization and certification of some gambling devices in licensed establishments, then the current Section 21-3-16 would result in any establishment which avails itself of the legal use of such devices being in violation of the Village Ordinance;

WHEREAS, the Village finds that the current Section with respect to the use of gambling devices in establishments in which alcoholic liquor is served, should be amended to reflect the legalization of some devices as defined in the Video Gaming Act, when conducted in accordance with the Video Gaming At (230 ILCS 40/1 et seq.);

WHEREAS, the Village finds that Section 21-3-16 of the Village Code, should be amended to allow for the use and placement of any video gaming terminal as defined in the Video Gaming Act if located in a "Licensed Liquor Establishment", "Licensed Fraternal Establishment", or "Licensed Veterans Establishment", as those terms defined in Section 5 of the Video Gaming Act (230 ILCS 40/5);

WHEREAS, the Village further finds the need to amend the existing Section for clarification purposes with respect to the conducting of the game of Bingo by such establishments.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, CRAWFORD COUNTY, ILLINOIS, THAT:

<u>SECTION 1: Amendment.</u> The following shall amend Section 21-3-16 of "<u>The Revised Code of Ordinances</u>" of the Village of Oblong, Crawford County, Illinois" and shall be as follows:

SEE EXHIBIT "A" FOLLOWING

SECTION 2: Severability of Provisions. Each section, paragraph, sentence, clause and provision of this Ordinance is severable, and if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of the Ordinance, nor any part thereof, other than that part affected by such decision.

SECTION 3: Conflicting Ordinances. Any conflicting ordinances, code provisions or pertinent portions thereof in effect at the time this ordinance takes effect are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: Effective. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

SECTION 5: Passed this 11th day of July, 2012 by the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Crawford County, Illinois, and deposited and filed in the office of the Village Clerk in said Village on that date.

ORDINANCE NO. 2012-O-548

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER FOR THE SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY FOR RESIDENTIAL AND SMALL COMMERCIAL RETAIL CUSTOMERS WHO DO NOT OPT OUT OF SUCH A PROGRAM

(Municipal electric aggregation)

WHEREAS, Section 1-92 of the Illinois Power Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3855/1- 92, permits a municipality, if authorized by referendum, to adopt an ordinance by which it may operate a program to solicit bids and enter into service agreements for the sale and purchase of electricity and related services and equipment to residential and small commercial customers who do not opt-out of such a program; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Oblong ("Village"), in a referendum held on November 6, 2012, submitted the public question of whether it should operate the program as an opt-out program; and

WHEREAS, the referendum passed by a majority vote of the qualified electors voting on the question; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board finds that the best interests of the Village are served by entering into an agreement with the lowest responsible bidder, pursuant to 20 ILCS 3855/1-92, to aggregate the residential and small commercial retail electric loads located within the Village and to arrange for competitive electric supply to these retail electrical accounts; and

WHEREAS, because electricity is a commodity for which supply bids typically are made each morning and expire the same day at the close of business, the Village must act promptly to accept any such desired bid in order to contractually guarantee a per kilowatt hour electric rate for its residential and small commercial customers; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Village Board of the Village of Oblong, Crawford County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, be and the same is hereby authorized to execute and deliver and the Village Clerk of the Village of Oblong, Illinois, be and the same is hereby authorized to attest to said execution of a service agreement with the lowest responsible bidder for the supply of electricity for residential and small commercial retail customers who do not opt out of such a program, said execution and attestation to take place within the applicable time constraints required by the bidder; provided, however, that the energy price to be paid per kilowatt hour pursuant to the agreement is less than the default rate currently in effect, resulting in savings for the Village's residential and small commercial retail customers.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately and shall remain in effect until such time as the year 2012 electricity aggregation program electric supplier selection process has been completed.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TERMS OF AN ELECTRIC FRANCHISE AGREEMENT WITH AMEREN ILLINOIS COMPANY d/b/a AMEREN ILLINOIS.

SECTION ONE: That the terms of the Electric Franchise Ordinance are hereby amended to compensate the Municipality in the amount of \$720, annually, within 30 days of the Anniversary Date (September 18) in lieu of the free service of 6,000 kwh's referenced in Section 4 of the Electric Franchise Ordinance. Hereafter the subject kwh's will continue to be subject to the Company's tariffs, rules and regulations now in effect and as amended from time to time, including any fees, charges, and payments obligated to be paid by Municipality there-under. Except as expressly modified by this Ordinance, the provisions of the Electric Franchise Ordinance shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

SECTION TWO: That all ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed effective upon the effective date of this Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE RENEWING AN EXISTING FRANCHISE AND GRANTING FOR A PERIOD OF 20 YEARS TO AMEREN ILLINOIS, A CORPORATION, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE FRANCHISE, RIGHT, PERMISSION AND AUTHORITY TO CONSTRUCT, RECONSTRUCT, EXCAVATE FOR, PLACE, REMOVE, EXTEND. MAINTAIN, AND OPERATE AN ELECTRIC UTILITY SYSTEM IN THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, COUNTY OF CRAWFORD AND STATE OF ILLINOIS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, COUNTY OF CRAWFORD, AND THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. It is the intent of the parties by this Ordinance to extend for an additional term, subject to the terms and conditions here stated, the authorization to Ameren Illinois, its successors and assigns, to construct, operate and maintain a utility system within the Village as originally authorized by Ordinance No. 236 approved on September 18, 1963 and amended by Ordinance No. 2013-O-549 on January 2, 2013. The parties acknowledge that by so doing they are continuing an existing relationship authorizing the services of a utility for the provision of electric energy and other purposes within the Village for the benefit of its citizens and residents as well as other consumers of electric energy located within its corporate limits. For purposes of construing the terms, rights and obligations of the parties this authorization is granted pursuant to Section 14 of the Electric Supplier Act, 220 ILCS 30/14, and the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5-1-1-1, et seq.

SECTION 2. There is hereby given and granted to Ameren Illinois, its successors and assigns (hereinafter referred to as the "Company"), the right, privilege and authority to construct, operate, maintain and/or extend within the corporate limits, as the same now exists or may hereafter be extended, of the Village of Oblong (hereinafter referred to as "Municipality"), an electric utility system for the transmission, distribution and/or sale of electric energy and other purposes (the "System"), together with the right, privilege and authority to erect, construct, install, operate and/or maintain all poles, conductors, wires, cables, conduits, equipment and/or other apparatus as may be necessary or convenient for the System, in, upon, along, over, under, through and/or across each and all of the streets, avenues, alleys, bridges, easements, rights of way and/or other public places.

SECTION 3. All poles and other equipment placed or installed under this Ordinance in streets, alleys, avenues, public places, or right-of-way, shall be so placed as not to interfere unnecessarily with travel on such streets, alleys, avenues, public places, or right-of-way. All poles and other equipment placed or installed under this Ordinance shall be so located as not to injure unnecessarily any pipes, conduits, sewers, drains, pavement or other like public improvements, and said Company shall forthwith repair any damage caused to such improvements to the satisfaction of the official or officials of said Municipality having charge of the supervision thereof and in default thereof said Municipality may repair such damage and charge the cost thereof to, and collect the same from, the Company. All facilities of Company in said Municipality shall be installed and maintained in accordance with the applicable rules and regulations of the Illinois Commerce Commission.

When any roadway within a right-of-way shall be graded, curbed, paved or otherwise changed or when there is a relocation of such right-of-way, so as to make the resetting or relocation of any poles or other equipment placed or installed under this Ordinance necessary,

the Company shall make such resetting or relocation, at the Company's cost and expense. Municipality shall provide the Company with a suitable location for the resetting or relocation of such poles or other equipment, and the Company's obligation shall be limited to resetting or relocating poles or other equipment of the same type and configuration as the displaced poles or other equipment. Company shall make such resetting or relocation within a reasonable time after receiving written notice of the need for the same from the authorized representative of the Municipality, and the establishment by the Municipality of the permanent grade at the new location. Except as expressly stated, nothing in this Section requires the Company to bear responsibility for any costs or expenses to relocate its poles or other equipment for any other reason or cause.

SECTION 4. In order for Company to render efficient, safe, and continuous services, it will be necessary for Company to conduct vegetation management activities, including the trimming or pruning and cutting down of the trunks and branches of trees and/or vines and shrubs along or over the streets, sidewalks, alleys, avenues, squares, bridges and other public places in said Municipality, and areas dedicated to the Municipality for public utility use, wherever the same are likely to interfere with its equipment; therefore, Company is hereby granted the right to conduct such vegetation management activities so as to enable it to provide the most efficient, safe, and continuous service that the circumstances will permit; provided, however, that Company shall exercise proper care and discretion in its vegetation management activities. Company shall conduct its vegetation management activities in accordance with applicable law, including without limitation, 220 ILCS 5/8-505.1, and any amendments thereto. Notwithstanding the foregoing, to the extent applicable law may be superceded or modified by an agreement between Municipality and Company, Municipality and Company reserve the right to enter into such an agreement.

SECTION 5. The rates to be charged by the Company for electric service rendered under this Ordinance shall be such as are approved from time to time by the Illinois Commerce Commission of the State of Illinois and/or such other duly constituted governmental authority as shall have jurisdiction thereof. All Rules and Regulations of the Illinois Commerce Commission of the State of Illinois applicable to the rights, privileges and authority granted by this Ordinance, in the event of conflict herewith, shall govern.

SECTION 6. As a further consideration for the rights, privileges and authorities granted by this ordinance, the Company shall, throughout the period in which Company shall exercise the rights, privileges and authority granted by this ordinance furnish to the said Municipality, compensation in the amount of \$9,975, payable annually, within 30 days of the anniversary date. Municipality may request a revision to the compensation amount after five years from the date of passage of this ordinance if Municipality has a reasonable belief that its population has increased or decreased by 3% or more. Municipality must request the revision at least 60 days prior to the next anniversary date. If Company confirms that the number of customers served by the System within Municipality's corporate limits has increased or decreased by 3% or more, the compensation amount will be revised by that percentage for the next and succeeding payments. Municipality may request similar revisions to compensation amounts under these criteria in additional five year periods throughout the term of this ordinance.

SECTION 7. If, at any time, during the term of this contract, Municipality permits another entity or person to provide electric distribution or similar services, and Company reasonably believes the other entity or person is granted more favorable treatment, terms, or

conditions, then Company shall notify Municipality of such treatment, terms, or conditions. Alternatively, if Municipality reasonably believes the other entity or person grants Municipality more favorable treatment, terms, or conditions, then Municipality shall notify Company of such treatment; terms, or conditions. Upon receipt of such notice, Municipality and Company shall negotiate in good faith to amend this ordinance to provide Company or Municipality such more favorable treatment, terms or conditions on an equivalent basis. Such amendment shall take into consideration all circumstances that distinguish between Company and the entity or person receiving the more favorable or less favorable treatment, terms, or conditions.

SECTION 8. The Company shall be exempt from any special tax, assessment, license, rental or other charge during the term of this Ordinance, on all poles, conductors, wires, cables, conduits, equipment and other apparatus placed in the streets, alleys, avenues, bridges, easements, rights of way or other public places within the corporate limits of Municipality.

SECTION 9. The rights, privileges and authority hereby granted shall inure to and be vested in Company, its successors and assigns, successively, subject to all of the terms, provisions and conditions herein contained, and each of the obligations hereby imposed upon Company shall devolve and be binding upon its successors and assigns, successively, in the same manner.

SECTION 10. This Ordinance shall confer no right, privilege or authority on Company, its successors or assigns, unless Company shall within ninety (90) days after due notice to the Company of the enactment of this Ordinance, file with the Village Clerk an acceptance of the terms and provisions hereof; provided, however, that if such acceptance be not so filed within said period of ninety (90) days, all rights, privileges, and authority herein granted shall become null and void.

SECTION 11. All rights, privileges and authority given and granted by this Ordinance are granted for a term of 20 years from and after the acceptance of this Ordinance as hereinafter provided (the "Initial Term"), and thereafter on a year-to-year basis (cach a "Subsequent Term") unless either the Company or Municipality notifies the other in writing of its desire to terminate this Ordinance at least six (6) months prior to the expiration of the Initial Term or any Subsequent Term.

SECTION 12. The Municipality acknowledges that Company is vested in rights, permissions and authority independent of this Ordinance. Neither acceptance of this Ordinance nor compliance with its provisions shall impair in any way or waive any right, permission or authority which Company may have independent of this Ordinance. In addition, neither use by Company of public property or places as authorized by this Ordinance nor service rendered by Company in said Municipality shall be treated as use solely of the rights, permission and authority provided for by this Ordinance and in no way shall indicate non-use of any right, permission or authority vested in the Company independent of this Ordinance. In the event the Municipality vacates any streets, avenues, alleys, easements, rights of way, bridges or other public places during the term of this Ordinance, Municipality agrees to reserve unto Company the rights, privileges and authority herein given and granted to the Company in upon, along, over and across each and all of such vacated premises which are at the time in use by the Company.

SECTION 13. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance or with any of its provisions are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION 14. This Ordinance shall not relieve Company of the obligation to comply with any ordinance now existing in the Municipality or enacted in the future requiring Company to obtain written permits or other approval from the Municipality prior to commencement of construction of facilities within the streets thereof, except Company shall not be required to obtain permits or other approval from the Municipality for the maintenance, upgrading and repair of its constructed facilities. Company shall provide notice of excavation hereunder in accordance with the Illinois Underground Utility Damage Prevention Act (220 ILCS 50/1,et seq.)

SECTION 15. If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application of such provision to particular circumstances, shall be held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance, or the application of such provision to circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid, shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 16. Any conflict between the Franchise Ordinance and the provisions contained in the Electric Service Customer Choice and Rate Relief Law of 1997 (Public Act 90-561) will be resolved by giving the state statute mandatory priority over any contrary language contained in the Franchise Ordinance.

SECTION 17. This Ordinance shall take effect and the rights, privileges and authority hereby granted and renewed shall vest in Company upon its filing of an acceptance with the Village Clerk according to the terms prescribed herein and as provided for in Section 12 and in IL Rev 35 ILCS 645/5-4. This Ordinance shall be in full force from and after its passage, approval and ten (10) day period of publication in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An ACT regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Chapter 820 ILCS 130/1-12, Illinois Compiled Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Crawford County, investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village of Oblong, Crawford County, employed in performing construction of public works, for said Village of Oblong; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, CRAWFORD COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1

To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works" approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Oblong is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Crawford County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, 2012, a copy of that determination being attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which area also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2

Nothing herein shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works of this Village of Oblong, to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this Village of Oblong this

determination of such prevailing rate wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State Index Division and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall cause a notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area that the determination of prevailing wages has been made. Said notice shall conform substantially to the notice attached hereto. Such publication shall constitute notice that this is the determination of Village of Oblong and is effective.

CRAWFORD COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

Oil and chip resealing (O&C) means the application of road oils and liquid asphalt to coat an existing road surface, followed by application of aggregate chips or gravel to coated surface, and subsequent rolling of material to seal the surface.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER, MARBLE FINISHER, TERRAZZO FINISHER

Assisting, helping or supporting the tile, marble and terrazzo mechanic by performing their historic and traditional work assignments required to complete the proper installation of the work covered by said crafts. The term "Ceramic" is used for naming the classification only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. Ceramic takes into consideration most hard tiles.

COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair, and service

of radio, television, recording, voice sound and vision production and reproduction apparatus, equipment and appliances used for domestic, commercial, education, entertainment and private telephone systems.

ELECTRIC POWER LINEMAN

Construction, maintenance and dismantling of overhead and underground electric power lines, including high voltage pipe type cable work, and associated structures and equipment.

ELECTRIC POWER EQUIPMENT OPERATOR - CLASS 1

Operation of all crawler type equipment D-4 and larger from the ground to assist the Electric Power Linemen in performing their duties.

ELECTRIC POWER EQUIPMENT OPERATORS - CLASS 2

Operation of all other equipment from the ground to assist the Electric Power Linemen in performing their duties.

ELECTRIC POWER GROUNDMAN

Applies to workers who assist the Electric Power Lineman from the ground.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, vactor trucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination units, and ticket writers.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics and working forepersons, and dispatchers. Five axle or more combination units.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.

Class 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing while employed on hazardous waste work.

TRUCK DRIVER - OIL AND CHIP RESEALING ONLY.

This shall encompass laborers, workers and mechanics who drive contractor or subcontractor owned, leased, or hired pickup, dump, service, or oil distributor trucks. The work includes transporting materials and equipment (including but not limited to, oils, aggregate supplies, parts, machinery and tools) to or from the job site; distributing oil or liquid asphalt and aggregate; stock piling material when in connection with the actual oil and chip contract. The Truck Driver (Oil & Chip Resealing) wage classification does not

include supplier delivered materials.

OPERATING ENGINEERS - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Power Cranes, Draglines, Derricks, Shovels, Gradalls, Mechanics, Tractor Highlift, Tournadozer, Concrete Mixers with Skip, Tournamixer, Two Drum Machine, One Drum Hoist with Tower or Boom, Cableways, Tower Machines, Motor Patrol, Boom Tractor, Boom or Winch Truck, Winch or Hydraulic Boom Truck, Truck Crane, Tournapull, Tractor Operating Scoops, Bulldozer, Push Tractor, Asphalt Planer, Finishing Machine on Asphalt, Large Rollers on Earth, Rollers on Asphalt Mix, Ross Carrier or similar Machine, Gravel Processing Machine, Asphalt Plant Engineer, Paver Operator, Dredging Equipment, or Dredge Engineer, or Dredge Operator, Central Mix Plant Engineer, CMI or similar type machine, Concrete Pump, Truck or Skid Mounted, Tower Crane, Engineer or Rock Crusher Plant, Concrete Plant Engineer, Ditching Machine with dual attachment, Tractor Mounted Loaders, Cherry Picker, Hydro Crane, Standard or Dinkey Locomotives, Scoopmobiles, Euclid Loader, Soil Cement Machine, Back Filler, Elevating Machine, Power Blade, Drilling Machine, including Well Testing, Caissons, Shaft or any similar type drilling machines, Motor Driven Paint Machine, Pipe Cleaning Machine, Pipe Wrapping Machine, Pipe Bending Machine, Apsco Paver, Boring Machine, (Head Equipment Greaser), Barber-Greene Loaders, Formless Paver, (Well Point System), Concrete Spreader, Hydra Ax, Span Saw, Marine Scoops, Brush Mulcher, Brush Burner, Mesh Placer, Tree Mover, Helicopter Crew (3), Piledriver-Skid or Crawler, Stump Remover, Root Rake, Tug Boat Operator, Refrigerating Machine, Freezing Operator, Chair Cart-Self-Propelled, Hydra Seeder, Straw Blower, Power Sub Grader, Bull Float, Finishing Machine, Self-Propelled Pavement Breaker, Lull (or similar type Machine), Two Air Compressors, Compressors hooked in Manifold, Overhead Crane, Chip Spreader, Mud Cat, Sull-Air, Fork Lifts (except when used for landscaping work), Soil Stabilizer (Seaman Tiller, Bo Mag, Rago Gator, and similar types of equipment), Tube Float, Spray Machine, Curing Machine, Concrete or Asphalt Milling Machine, Snooper Truck-Operator, Backhoe, Farm Tractors (with attachments), 4 Point Lift System (Power Lift or similar type), Skid-Steer (Bob Cat or similar type), Wrecking Shears, Water Blaster.

Class 2. Concrete Mixers without Skips, Rock Crusher, Ditching Machine under 6', Curbing Machine, One Drum Machines without Tower or Boom, Air Tugger, Self-Propelled Concrete Saw, Machine Mounted Post Hole Digger, two to four Generators, Water Pumps or Welding Machines, within 400 feet, Air Compressor 600 cu. ft. and under, Rollers on Aggregate and Seal Coat Surfaces, Fork Lift (when used for landscaping work), Concrete and Blacktop Curb Machine, One Water Pump, Oilers, Air Valves or Steam Valves, One Welding Machine, Truck Jack, Mud Jack, Gunnite Machine, House Elevators when used for hoisting material, Engine Tenders, Fireman, Wagon Drill, Flex Plane, Conveyor, Siphons and Pulsometer, Switchman, Fireman on Paint Pots, Fireman on Asphalt Plants, Distributor Operator on Trucks, Tampers, Self-Propelled Power Broom, Striping Machine (motor driven), Form Tamper, Bulk Cement Plant, Equipment Greaser, Deck Hands, Truck Crane Oiler-Driver, Cement Blimps, Form Grader, Temporary Heat, Throttle Valve, Super Sucker (and similar type of equipment).

If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

ORDINANCE No. 2014-0-562

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An ACT regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Chapter 820 ILCS 130/1-12, Illinois Compiled Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Crawford County, investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village of Oblong, Crawford County, employed in performing construction of public works, for said Village of Oblong; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, CRAWFORD COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1

To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works" approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Oblong is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Crawford County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, 2014, a copy of that determination being attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which area also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2

Nothing herein shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works of this Village of Oblong, to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this Village of Oblong this determination of such prevailing rate wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State Index Division and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall cause a notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area that the determination of prevailing wages has been made. Said notice shall conform substantially to the notice attached hereto. Such publication shall constitute notice that this is the determination of Village of Oblong and is effective.

CRAWFORD COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties.

Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

Oil and chip resealing (O&C) means the application of road oils and liquid asphalt to coat an existing road surface, followed by application of aggregate chips or gravel to coated surface, and subsequent rolling of material to seal the surface.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER, MARBLE FINISHER, TERRAZZO FINISHER

Assisting, helping or supporting the tile, marble and terrazzo mechanic by performing their historic and traditional work assignments required to complete the proper installation of the work covered by said crafts. The term "Ceramic" is used for naming the classification only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. Ceramic takes into consideration most hard tiles.

COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair, and service of radio, television, recording, voice sound and vision production and reproduction apparatus, equipment and appliances used for domestic, commercial, education, entertainment and private telephone systems.

ELECTRIC POWER LINEMAN

Construction, maintenance and dismantling of overhead and underground electric power lines, including high voltage pipe type cable work, and associated structures and

equipment.

ELECTRIC POWER EQUIPMENT OPERATOR - CLASS 1

Operation of all crawler type equipment D-4 and larger from the ground to assist the Electric Power Linemen in performing their duties.

ELECTRIC POWER EQUIPMENT OPERATORS - CLASS 2

Operation of all other equipment from the ground to assist the Electric Power Linemen in performing their duties.

ELECTRIC POWER GROUNDMAN

Applies to workers who assist the Electric Power Lineman from the ground.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION
Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, vactor trucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination units, and ticket writers.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics and working forepersons, and dispatchers. Five axle or more combination units.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.

Class 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing while employed on hazardous waste work.

SURVEY WORKER - Operated survey equipment including data collectors, G.P.S. and robotic instruments, as well as conventional levels and transits.

TRUCK DRIVER - OIL AND CHIP RESEALING ONLY.

This shall encompass laborers, workers and mechanics who drive contractor or subcontract owned, leased, or hired pickup, dump, service, or oil distributor trucks. The work incl transporting materials and equipment (including but not limited to, oils, aggregate supp parts, machinery and tools) to or from the job site; distributing oil or liquid asphalt aggregate; stock piling material when in connection with the actual oil and chip contract The Truck Driver (Oil & Chip Resealing) wage classification does not include supplier delivered materials.

OPERATING ENGINEERS - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Power Cranes, Draglines, Derricks, Shovels, Gradalls, Mechanics, Tractor Highlift, Tournadozer, Concrete Mixers with Skip, Tournamixer, Two Drum Machine, One Drum Hoist with Tower or Boom, Cableways, Tower Machines, Motor Patrol, Boom Tractor, Boom or Winch Truck, Winch or Hydraulic Boom Truck, Truck Crane, Tournapull, Tractor Operating Scoops, Bulldozer, Push Tractor, Asphalt Planer, Finishing Machine on Asphalt, Large Rollers on Earth, Rollers on Asphalt Mix, Ross Carrier or similar Machine, Gravel Processing Machine, Asphalt Plant Engineer, Paver Operator, Dredging Equipment, or Dredge Engineer, or Dredge Operator, Central Mix Plant Engineer, CMI or similar type machine, Concrete Pump, Truck or Skid Mounted, Tower Crane, Engineer or Rock Crusher Plant, Concrete Plant Engineer,

Ditching Machine with dual attachment, Tractor Mounted Loaders, Cherry Picker, Hydro Crane, Standard or Dinkey Locomotives, Scoopmobiles, Euclid Loader, Soil Cement Machine, Back Filler, Elevating Machine, Power Blade, Drilling Machine, including Well Testing, Caissons, Shaft or any similar type drilling machines, Motor Driven Paint Machine, Pipe Cleaning Machine, Pipe Wrapping Machine, Pipe Bending Machine, Apsco Paver, Boring Machine, (Head Equipment Greaser), Barber-Greene Loaders, Formless Paver, (Well Point System), Concrete Spreader, Hydra Ax, Span Saw, Marine Scoops, Brush Mulcher, Brush Burner, Mesh Placer, Tree Mover, Helicopter Crew (3), Piledriver-Skid or Crawler, Stump Remover, Root Rake, Tug Boat Operator, Refrigerating Machine, Freezing Operator, Chair Cart-Self-Propelled, Hydra Seeder, Straw Blower, Power Sub Grader, Bull Float, Finishing Machine, Self-Propelled Pavement Breaker, Lull (or similar type Machine), Two Air Compressors, Compressors hooked in Manifold, Overhead Crane, Chip Spreader, Mud Cat, Sull-Air, Fork Lifts (except when used for landscaping work), Soil Stabilizer (Seaman Tiller, Bo Mag, Rago Gator, and similar types of equipment), Tube Float, Spray Machine, Curing Machine, Concrete or Asphalt Milling Machine, Snooper Truck-Operator, Backhoe, Farm Tractors (with attachments), 4 Point Lift System (Power Lift or similar type), Skid-Steer (Bob Cat or similar type), Wrecking Shears, Water Blaster.

Class 2. Concrete Mixers without Skips, Rock Crusher, Ditching Machine under 6', Curbing Machine, One Drum Machines without Tower or Boom, Air Tugger, Self-Propelled Concrete Saw, Machine Mounted Post Hole Digger, two to four Generators, Water Pumps or Welding Machines, within 400 feet, Air Compressor 600 cu. ft. and under, Rollers on Aggregate and Seal Coat Surfaces, Fork Lift (when used for landscaping work), Concrete and Blacktop Curb Machine, One Water Pump, Oilers, Air Valves or Steam Valves, One Welding Machine, Truck Jack, Mud Jack, Gunnite Machine, House Elevators when used for hoisting material, Engine Tenders, Fireman, Wagon Drill, Flex Plane, Conveyor, Siphons and Pulsometer, Switchman, Fireman on Paint Pots, Fireman on Asphalt Plants, Distributor Operator on Trucks, Tampers, Self-Propelled Power Broom, Striping Machine (motor driven), Form Tamper, Bulk Cement Plant, Equipment Greaser, Deck Hands, Truck Crane Oiler-Driver, Cement Blimps, Form Grader, Temporary Heat, Throttle Valve, Super Sucker (and similar type of equipment).

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck river.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2014-0-563

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF GROUNDWATER AS A POTABLE WATER SUPPLY BY THE INSTALLATION OR USE OF POTABLE WATER SUPPLY WELLS OR BY ANY OTHER METHOD WITHIN A LIMITED AREA OF THE VILLAGE

WHEREAS, certain properties in the Village of Oblong, Illinois have been used over a period of time for commercial/industrial purposes; and

WHEREAS, because of said use, concentrations of certain chemical constituents in the groundwater beneath a very limited area within the Village of Oblong may exceed Class 1 groundwater quality standards for the potable resource groundwater as set forth in 35 Illinois Administrative Code 620 or Tier 1 remediation objectives as set forth in 35 Illinois Administrative Code 742: and

WHEREAS, the Village of Oblong desires to limit potential threats for human health from groundwater contamination while facilitating the redevelopment and productive use of properties that are the source of said chemical constituents;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, ILLINOIS;

Section One. Use of groundwater as a potable water supply is prohibited within a very limited area within the Village of Oblong. The area which prohibits the use of groundwater as a potable water supply is the area bound by Missouri Street to the south, Illinois Street to the north, Garfield to the west and Harrison Street to the east. This area includes a projection of Harrison Street toward the south and a projection of Missouri Street toward the east until both would intersect were they to be through streets. The attached drawing, Exhibit A, illustrates the location of the area affected by the ordinance.

Except for such uses or methods in existence before the effective date of this ordinance, the use of or attempt to use as a potable water supply groundwater from within the limited area within the Village of Oblong, as a potable water supply, by the installation or drilling of wells or by any other method is hereby prohibited. The prohibition expressly includes the area described in Section One of this ordinance and in Exhibit A. This prohibition expressly includes the Village of Oblong.

Section Two. Penalties.

Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of up to \$750.00 for each violation.

Section Three. Definitions.

"Person" is any individual, partnership, co-partnership, firm, company, limited liability company, corporation, association, joint stock company, trust, estate, political subdivision, or any other legal entity, or their legal representatives, agents or assigns.

"Potable water" is any water used for human or domestic consumption, including, but not limited to, water used for drinking, bathing, swimming, washing dishes or preparing foods.

Section Four. Repealer.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they are in conflict with this ordinance.

Section Five. Severability.

If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or under any circumstances is adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or of any portion not adjudged invalid.

Section Six. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly possess a product containing a synthetic cannabinoid, a synthetic stimulant, or a synthetic psychedelic/hallucinogen, including but not limited to those listed in the below table, with the intent of using the product for ingestion, consumption, inhaling, or intravenous use. In determining intent under this subsection, a trier of fact may take into consideration, among other things; the proximity of the product to drug paraphernalia the presence of the product on or within drug paraphernalia; the proximity of the product to a different controlled substance; and whether or not the individual in possession of the product is exhibiting physical effects commonly associated with being under the influence of a controlled substance.
- (d) <u>Use</u>. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or be under the influence of a synthetic cannabinoid, a synthetic stimulant, or a synthetic psychedelic/hallucinogen, including but not limited to those listed in the below table.
- (e) Manufacture. It shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture, or assemble the ingredients with the intent to manufacture, a synthetic cannabinoid, a synthetic stimulant, or a synthetic psychedelic/hallucinogen, including but not limited to those listed in the below table. In determining intent under this subsection, a trier of fact may take into consideration, among other things; the proximity of the product or ingredients to drug paraphernalia; the presence of the product or ingredients on or within drug paraphernalia; the proximity of the product or ingredients to a different controlled substance.

ORDINANCE NO. 2015-O-568

An ordinance appropriating for all corporate purposes for the Village of Oblong, Crawford County, Illinois, for the fiscal year beginning May 1st, 2015, and ending April 30th, 2016.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Crawford County, Illinois:

SECTION 1: That the amount hereinafter set forth, or so much thereof as may be authorized by law, and as may be needed or deemed necessary to defray all expenses and liabilities of the municipality be and the same are hereby appropriated for the corporate purposes of the Village of Oblong, Crawford County, Illinois, as hereinafter specified for the fiscal year beginning May 1st, 2015, and ending April 30th, 2016.

SECTION 2: That the appropriation herein made for any purpose shall be regarded as the maximum amounts to be expended under the respective appropriation accounts and shall not be construed as a commitment, agreement, obligation or liability of the Village of Oblong, and such appropriation being subject to further approval as to expenditure thereof by the Village Board.

ORDINANCE No. 2015-O-569

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An ACT regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Chapter 820 ILCS 130/1-12, Illinois Compiled Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Oblong, Crawford County, investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village of Oblong, Crawford County, employed in performing construction of public works, for said Village of Oblong; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OBLONG, CRAWFORD COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1

To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works" approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Oblong is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Crawford County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, 2014, a copy of that determination being attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which area also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2

Nothing herein shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works of this Village of Oblong, to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this Village of Oblong this determination of such prevailing rate wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State Index Division and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6

The Village of Oblong Village Clerk shall cause a notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area that the determination of prevailing wages has been made. Said notice shall conform substantially to the notice attached hereto. Such publication shall constitute notice that this is the determination of Village of Oblong and is effective.

Explanations

CRAWFORD COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

Oil and chip resealing (O&C) means the application of road oils and liquid asphalt to coat an existing road surface, followed by application of aggregate chips or gravel to coated surface, and subsequent rolling of material to seal the surface.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER, MARBLE FINISHER, TERRAZZO FINISHER

Assisting, helping or supporting the tile, marble and terrazzo mechanic by performing their historic and traditional work assignments required to complete the proper installation of the work covered by said crafts. The term "Ceramic" is used for naming the classification only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. Ceramic takes into consideration most hard tiles.

COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair, and service of radio, television, recording, voice sound and vision production and reproduction apparatus, equipment and appliances used for domestic, commercial, education, entertainment and private telephone systems.

ELECTRIC POWER LINEMAN

Construction, maintenance and dismantling of overhead and underground electric power lines, including high voltage pipe type cable work, and associated structures and equipment.

ELECTRIC POWER EQUIPMENT OPERATOR - CLASS 1

Operation of all crawler type equipment D-4 and larger from the ground to assist the Electric Power Linemen in performing their duties.

ELECTRIC POWER EQUIPMENT OPERATORS - CLASS 2

Operation of all other equipment from the ground to assist the Electric Power Linemen in performing their duties.

ELECTRIC POWER GROUNDMAN

Applies to workers who assist the Electric Power Lineman from the ground.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

- Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, vactor trucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination units, and ticket writers.
- Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics and working forepersons, and dispatchers. Five axle or more combination units.
- Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.
- Class 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing while employed on hazardous waste work.

SURVEY WORKER - Operated survey equipment including data collectors, G.P.S. and robotic instruments, as well as conventional levels and transits.

TRUCK DRIVER - OIL AND CHIP RESEALING ONLY.

This shall encompass laborers, workers and mechanics who drive contractor or subcontractor owned, leased, or hired pickup, dump, service, or oil distributor trucks. The work includes transporting materials and equipment (including but not limited to, oils, aggregate supplies, parts, machinery and tools) to or from the job site; distributing oil or liquid asphalt and aggregate; stock piling material when in connection with the actual oil and chip contract. The Truck Driver (Oil & Chip Resealing) wage classification does not include supplier delivered materials.

OPERATING ENGINEERS - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION Class 1. Draglines, Derricks, Shovels, Gradalls, Mechanics, Tractor Highlift, Tournadozer, Concrete Mixers with Skip, Tournamixer, Two Drum Machine, One Drum Hoist with Tower or Boom, Cableways, Tower Machines, Motor Patrol, Boom Tractor, Boom or Winch Truck, Winch or Hydraulic Boom Truck, Tournapull, Tractor Operating Scoops, Bulldozer, Push Tractor, Asphalt Planer, Finishing Machine on Asphalt, Large Rollers on Earth, Rollers on Asphalt Mix, Ross Carrier or similar Machine, Gravel Processing Machine, Asphalt Plant Engineer, Paver Operator, Dredging Equipment, or Dredge Engineer, or Dredge Operator, Central Mix Plant Engineer, CMI or similar type machine, Concrete Pump, Truck or Skid Mounted, Engineer or Rock Crusher Plant, Concrete Plant Engineer, Ditching Machine with dual attachment, Tractor Mounted Loaders, Hydro Crane, Standard or Dinkey Locomotives, Scoopmobiles, Euclid Loader, Soil Cement Machine, Back Filler, Elevating Machine, Power Blade, Drilling Machine, including Well Testing, Caissons, Shaft or any similar type drilling machines, Motor Driven Paint Machine, Pipe Cleaning Machine, Pipe Wrapping Machine, Pipe Bending Machine, Apsco Paver, Boring Machine, (Head Equipment Greaser), Barber-Greene Loaders, Formless Paver, (Well Point System), Concrete Spreader, Hydra Ax, Span Saw, Marine Scoops, Brush Mulcher, Brush Burner, Mesh Placer, Tree Mover, Helicopter Crew (3), Piledriver-Skid or Crawler, Stump Remover, Root Rake, Tug Boat Operator, Refrigerating Machine, Freezing Operator, Chair Cart-Self-Propelled, Hydra Seeder, Straw Blower, Power Sub Grader, Bull Float, Finishing Machine, Self-Propelled Pavement Breaker, Lull (or similar type Machine), Two Air Compressors, Compressors hooked in Manifold, Chip Spreader, Mud Cat, Sull-Air, Fork Lifts (except when used for landscaping work), Soil Stabilizer (Seaman Tiller, Bo Mag, Rago Gator, and similar types of equipment), Tube Float, Spray Machine, Curing Machine, Concrete or Asphalt Milling Machine, Snooper Truck-Operator, Backhoe, Farm Tractors (with attachments), 4 Point Lift System (Power Lift or similar type), Skid Steer (Bob Cat or similar type), Wrecking Shears, Water Blaster.

Class 2. Concrete Mixers without Skips, Rock Crusher, Ditching Machine under 6', Curbing Machine, One Drum Machines without Tower or Boom, Air Tugger, Self-Propelled Concrete Saw, Machine Mounted Post Hole Digger, two to four Generators, Water Pumps or Welding Machines, within 400 feet, Air Compressor 600 cu. ft. and under, Rollers on Aggregate and Seal Coat Surfaces, Fork Lift (when used for landscaping work), Concrete and Blacktop Curb Machine, One Water Pump, Oilers, Air Valves or Steam Valves, One Welding Machine, Truck Jack, Mud Jack, Gunnite Machine, House Elevators when used for hoisting material, Engine Tenders, Fireman, Wagon Drill, Flex Plane, Conveyor, Siphons and Pulsometer, Switchman, Fireman on Paint Pots, Fireman

on Asphalt Plants, Distributor Operator on Trucks, Tampers, Self-Propelled Power Broom, Striping Machine (motor driven), Form Tamper, Bulk Cement Plant, Equipment Greaser, Deck Hands, Truck Crane Oiler-Driver, Cement Blimps, Form Grader, Temporary Heat, Throttle Valve, Super Sucker(and similar type of equipment).

Class 3. Power Cranes, Truck or Crawler Crane, Rough Terrain Crane (Cherry Picker), Tower Crane, Overhead Crane.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to them ask, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.
